
How to find your child's CAASPP

scores

For parents of students in grades 4- 8, the California state- wide assessments (CAASPP) scores are in. Parents and students can access these results by logging in to the Illuminate Parent Portal. On the side bar, there is a tab to State- wide Assessments. Next, select the year and test you would like to see and download the results.

Every year, California students in grades 3-8 and 11 are required to participate in the state- wide assessments. This year we will be taking them at the end of Aprilbeginning of May. More information will be sent later in the year.
